





### A CHANGING CULTURE OF ASSESSMENT

- Greater variety of assessment activity- "fit for purpose" and relevant to students
- Teachers talking to teachers about assessment
- Building capacity, knowledge and confidence in assessment, in schools




# Exams will be set, held and marked by the State Examinations Commission in June of third year.

# Ongoing assessment that supports student learning

### CLASSROOM-BASED ASSESSMENT

- Classroom-Based Assessments (CBA's) students demonstrate understanding and skills.
- Facilitate developmental feedback
- Tasks include oral presentations, written work, practical activities, scientific experiments and projects, etc


